Better know a non-nuke: Belarus

In the latest episode of the Arms Control Primer podcast, host Dr Alexander Bollfrass is joined by Dr Alexander Sorg and Elena Sokova to discuss the nuclear history of Belarus in the Cold War context, as well as the deployment of Russia's nuclear-capable systems on Belarusian territory. The guests analyse the strategic reasons behind this deployment, and as Dr Sorg reflects: "It's a somewhat open question why Russia deploys nuclear weapons to Belarus. The simplest idea would be that it might just be another nuclear signal. It's Russia saying, 'look, we expand the role of nuclear weapons in all sorts of ways and you better watch out. And our deployment to Belarus is one of these ways.' It could be about the defence of the Belarusian regime. Lukashenko might be quite afraid that the West will support opposition forces in Belarus, and the West - or NATO or European countries - might think twice about supporting opposition forces in a state that holds nuclear weapons, just because of the fact that if there's "chaos" in that state, then you have a 'loose nuke' situation."

SIPRI and the EU Non-Proliferation and Disarmament Consortium (EUNPDC) are pleased to announce that they will host a course on weapons of mass destruction (WMD) non-proliferation and disarmament in an era of technological convergence.
