## SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND FOOD SECURITY: EXPLORING NEW PATTERNS OF GOVERNANCE



At the outset of the new Sustainable Development Goals, food security remains one of the most urgent issues to tackle for actual and future generations. Although progress was made in the last decades, the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) estimates that 805 million people between 2012-2014 were still chronically undernourished. Food security, water management and climate change are some of the transnational issues that require a broad coordination of efforts from all actors and at different levels (global, regional, national and local). Globalisation is eroding the ability of nation-states to fulfil their public goals on their own and this international seminar aims at debating the paradigm shift needed to achieve food security and other key development objectives worldwide.

The first panel will discuss models of multi-level governance which distribute the decision-making authority across the sub and supranational level to address the issue of food security in an integrative way.

The second panel will discuss the multi-actor approach necessary to attain sustainable development goals. Specifically, it will examine the ways the private sector, trough Public Private Partnerships, may overcome some difficulties of institutional stakeholders at providing public service and implementing their development agenda.
