The **Youth Lab** is a closed workshop gathering young people and linked to the morning public debate "The migratory phenomena between facts and political narrative."

We are looking for **25-30 enthusiastic young persons** aged 18 to 30 from all over Europe (profiles with a somewhat older age may be considered if justified in the motivation letter). They will be urged not only to **reflect on the relationship between migration and political narrative**, but also to provide **practical guidelines to combat disinformation in society** and in the youth world in particular.

Participants will be asked to work in plenary and smaller groups to develop policy suggestions or simply simple guidelines using the Structured Dialogue mode. These ideas will subsequently be delivered in Brussels by **two "youth ambassadors"** chosen by the organizers at the project's final event on February 1, 2024.

Radar's Youth Lab strives for **equal representation** of genders, countries, and studies or employment profiles, so a quite detailed registration for selection purposes will be required.



Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must be between the ages of 18 and 30 years old;

Applicants must possess knowledge or express interest in disinformation and the selected policy areas;

Applicants must have a residency in a Member State of the European Union;

Applicants must demonstrate proficiency in English.
