

Ryo Sahashi

Professor of International Politics, and Director, Center for Asian Studies, Kanagawa University

Dr Sahashi specializes in international politics and is currently focusing on East Asian security as well as Japanese security policy. His recent book is *In a Search for Coexistence: the United States and Two Chinas during the Cold War* (Tokyo: Keiso, 2015). In English, he recently edited *Looking for Leadership: The Dilemma of Political Leadership in Japan* (Tokyo and New York: Japan Center for International Exchange, 2015), and wrote “Japan-Taiwan Relations since 2008: An Evolving, Practical, Non-Strategic Partnership,” and “The Rise of China and the Transformation of Asia-Pacific Security Architecture,” in Routledge scholarship respectively. He is writing his next books (single authored and edited volumes) on East Asia security order and on comparative studies of US allies’ perspectives on the US and the management of their relationship.

Concurrently, he teaches at University of Tokyo and Sophia University, serves as Research Fellow, Japan Center for International Exchange, and participates research projects at Japan Institute of International Affairs. He regularly contributes to NHK, Nikkei (Nihon Keizai Shimbun), Asahi Shimbun, Japan Times and other major media outlets.

Dr Sahashi started his academic career as faculty started with the University of Tokyo and Australian National University. He joined Kanagawa University in 2010. He has been Visiting Associate Professor, Walter H. Shorenstein Asia Pacific Research Center, Stanford University and Shigeru Yoshida Chair, Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México (ITAM). He also served as adjunct Senior Research Fellow at Sasakawa Peace Foundation, Tokyo Foundation-German Marshall Fund of the United States Partnership Fellow, and Guest Researcher for First Special Committee Research Office, House of Councilors.

He received his B.A. from International Christian University and his Ph.D. from the Graduate Schools for Law and Politics at the University of Tokyo. He also studied at Department of Political Science, University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.
