Young Women and Next Generation Initiative in Non-Proliferation and Disarmament Mentorship Programme Final Meeting

Background

The Vienna Center for Disarmament and Non-Proliferation (VCDNP) and the International Affairs Institute (IAI) in the framework of the EU Non-Proliferation and Disarmament (EUNPD) Consortium have launched a *Young Women and Next Generation Initiative*, a new initiative to encourage young women and the next generation to enter the non-proliferation, arms control and disarmament field.

Driven by the widely perceived age and gender imbalances among experts and practitioners in the non-proliferation, arms control and disarmament field, the *Young Women and Next Generation Initiative* aims to help address such imbalances by exposing college and university level students to arms control issues, increasing their awareness of them and encouraging their participation in events and workshops. The initiative also aims to respond to the very limited offering of relevant courses on WMD issues in colleges and universities at undergraduate and master's level. The goal is to help students understand how to pursue a career in the field, making the best use of their own skills.

The Initiative includes the creation of a mentorship programme, the conveying of workshops and meetings, and the organization of outreach visits at universities.

Mentorship Programme

Inspired by the <u>CNS Young Women in Nonproliferation Initiative (YWINI) Mentorship Program</u>, the Young Women and Next Generation Initiative (YWNGI) Mentorship Programme aimed at offering a similar opportunity for young women in undergraduate, graduate and post-graduate studies in Europe and third countries by pairing successful candidates (mentees) with well-established experts (mentors).

Final Meeting

The final meeting will be an opportunity to bring Mentors and Mentees together and strengthen their network. The meeting will also be an occasion for organizers to get feedback on the programme and learn from Mentors and Mentees' experiences. The meeting will be held online via Zoom.
